







- 1 select a measure
 - 2 open the Lines palette
 - 3 choose the straight line
 - 4 drop selected line to the measure
 - 5 mark the line in the measure and choose "properties"
 - 6 choose a new thickness if you wish and choose a colour on the "Aussehen" button
 - 7 move the colour line to the staff line you want and cover the original black line
- Repeat the process for the other lines, using the other colours you want.
- Unfortunately, with this solution the notes are covered by the line. In MuseScore 3.6.2 I think it was the possibility to declare the lines behind the notes, but I don't know about this possibility in MuseScore 4.3.2
